Matthew Armstrong SMUSD Visual and Performing arts Coordinator

We are so happy to be working with Matthew Armstrong to further music education within the San Marcos Unified School District. Mr. Armstrong began teaching at San Marcos High School in 2004 and in 2015 accepted the position of Visual and Performing Arts Coordinator for San Marcos Unified. Named San Marcos High School Teacher of the Year, and San Marcos Unified Teacher of the year in 2013, Music Educator of the Year for California Music Educators Association in 2015, he is a highly sought after performer, clinician, composer, arranger and arts advocate. In the community, he chairs the education committee for the North County Arts Network and has established the San Marcos Arts Collaborative as vehicle for coordinating arts efforts through San Marcos. As a performer he freelances throughout San Diego and regularly performs in San Diego Symphony chamber ensembles, has held the position of principal percussionist with the California Chamber Orchestra, and works throughout San Diego in jazz and dixie ensembles. Mr. Armstrong has taken groups to prestigious events all over the world including Japan, England, France, Switzerland, Italy, Austria, Germany, Australia, China and special performances at the Hawaii International Jazz Festival, concerts for U.S. Presidents, the Bands of America National Concert Band Festival and 5 appearances at the National Percussion Ensemble Festival and. Mr. Armstrong is a member of Percussive Arts Society, and the Southern California Band and Orchestra Association, California Music Educators Association and NafME. Mr. Armstrong teaches and performs as an Innovative Percussion Artist.

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
